Abstract. Tigrinya is a Semitic language spoken in Eritrea and in the Tigray Region of Northern Ethiopia. Tigrinya is one of the nine languages in Eritrea. It was one of Eritrea's official languages (along with Arabic) during the short-lived federation with Ethiopia (1952-1962).

Tigrinya originates from the ancient language of Ge'ez which is believed to be the common ancestor of modern Ethiopian Semitic languages. Tigrinya uses a 32 letter alphabet adopted from Ge'ez. Tigrinya Literature. The first known written work in Tigrinya is a text of local laws that is thought to have been written in the 13 th century.

The Tigrinya people, who are also known as the Kebessa people, are the largest ethnic group in Eritrea. They speak Tigrinya, a Semetic language derived from Ge'ez, and largely inhabit the plateau of the country. Because of their language and script (Fidel), many colonial-era scholars assumed Tigrinya people were of a mixed Yemeni (Sabaeen) and Eritrean origin.

Tigrinya language, also spelled Tigrigna, also called Tigray or Tigrai, a Semitic language of the Tigray people of northern Ethiopia and southern Eritrea. Written records include religious texts

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prepared by mission societies and an increasing number of textbooks and literary works. The language is closely related to Ge'ez, the ancient language of Ethiopia, and to the Tigré language.
